WEB LADDER SAFETY AND INFORMATION:

Please familiarize yourself and your employees using the ladder with these and other parts of this document.

- **DO** inspect the ladder prior to each installation or at regular intervals if ladder is installed for extended periods of time.
- **DO** remove the ladder from service if there is any evidence of a rung missing rivets.
- **DO** remove the ladder from service if any rungs are cracked or broken.
- **DO** make sure the ladder is attached properly prior to climbing.
- **DO** make sure that all users read and understand these instructions.

- **DO NOT** climb the ladder without being certain that it has been suspended properly.
- **DO NOT** allow the webbing to come into contact with any sharp objects or rough edges. This is especially important once the ladder is suspended.
- **DO NOT** allow more than two persons or persons weighing more than 620 lbs. to climb the ladder.
- **DO NOT** use a ladder that has any broken or damaged components.

Inspecting your ladder: Inspect the entire ladder for defects or damages to any of the materials before using the ladder. Please use the following guidelines during the inspection procedure:

1. **Webbing:** The webbing rails of the ladder are very important to the strength of the system. The webbing should be inspected in the same fashion as a fall protection lanyard, observing the entire length for damage. If there are any cuts, the ladder should be removed immediately from use. Close attention should be given also to the area immediately close to the soft loops because this is potentially the weakest part of the webbing.
2. **Rungs:** The rungs should be inspected for signs of cracks or missing rivets. If a rung is cracked, the ladder has been overloaded or misused and it should be removed from use.
